Year 9-10 Achievement Targets

BYOD

We acknowledge the support from whaanau in setting learners up with BYOD for their 2020 school year. These are an invaluable resource in supporting an engaging curriculum and increasing independence in our learners. We expect that digital devices are used in all learning areas, and that along with use in Whaanau Roopuu time, using Career Central or KAMAR, students will find using their own device a great advantage in their learning journey at Pukekohe High School. If you have sent your child to school with BYOD and have not yet completed a BYOD registration form, please collect one from the Student Centre or download from our website, under the Learning tab.

Career Central

Career Central is our new careers development online tool. All students have been using this to prepare for Academic Conferences, setting goals and beginning to explore the pathway that leads them from school to the world beyond Pukekohe High School. We look forward to students sharing their thinking so far with you at Academic Conferences this week.

Polyfest

KAMAR App

 - a. Name your Name
 - b. Portal Address / Server Address: pukekohe.school.kiwi
 - c. Username: Your username
 - d. Password: Your password

v.Then on the login screen your details should be entered automatically, so if you click Login it should log you in.

Student and Whaanau Handbook 2020

UNIFORM

The standard of our uniform is very high at present and we are keen to maintain that throughout the term.

Correct uniform means wearing all Pukekohe High School uniform items – these are specifically designed for our school and have the Pukekohe High School emblem on them. This includes senior uniform skirts. Our senior uniform skirts are black with pleats in the front and should reach the knee. Uniform notice for students:

If for any reason you are not able to wear the correct uniform on a specific day you need to bring a note from home and go to the Student Support Centre at the beginning of the day where you can get a uniform pass from a Kaitiaki Aakonga. This information is recorded on your pastoral record in our student management system KAMAR.

If for any reason you are not able to get a uniform item at all you need to see your Kaitiaki Aakonga and they can assist getting this for you.

ROAD SAFETY IN THE VICINITY OF THE SCHOOL

Each of our pedestrian crossings has duty teachers allocated, both before and after school, as a way of both keeping our students safe while crossing and also keeping traffic moving relatively freely.

However, safety in the school's car parks is a major concern for us with a dangerous combination of pedestrians and cars, particularly at the end of the school day.

To help, drivers must not use any school car park to drop off or collect students. Instead, it would be helpful if students were dropped off at least 100 metres from any of the driveways into the school. Thank you for your help.
