WELCOME TO THE 2018 SCHOOL YEAR and a particular welcome to new students and families who begin their association with Pukekohe High School.

We have 500 new students this year and this number continues to increase with on-going enrolments. Year 9s account for 420 of these students and this is the biggest year 9 roll in the history of the school. As is our tradition, the school year started with a powhiri for those new students who were recent enrolments, along with 28 new members of staff.

NEW STAFF

In a time of a much publicised teacher shortage, we have been very successful in being able to recruit teachers for all but three vacancies. Through a combination of retirements, teachers on leave and teachers moving to other schools, we ended the year with 18 teacher vacancies and five non-teacher vacancies. An anticipated increasing roll has resulted in 23 teaching and 4 non-teaching appointments being made. Among these we have seven teachers from overseas and eight New Zealand-trained first year teachers. Among our new staff there are four ex-students of the school. The three unfilled teaching positions are being covered by three of our regular and experienced relievers until permanent appointments can be made.

MISSING NCEA GRADES

Recent media articles have pointed to some students from last year not having NCEA credits that they had achieved being recorded on their Records of Achievement. Contact from one such student alerted us to 11 students in a Level 3 class being affected in this way. While this was quickly corrected, our investigations of why this occurred clearly identified that the fault lay with the school in that a set of grades that were supposedly transferred to NZQA had not been done so. This clearly would have caused distress to the affected students which the school regrets and apologises for.

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A second case affected 7 students across a range of subjects. These students were part of a large transfer of NCEA grades to NZQA but had their submitted "Achieved" grades changed to "Not achieved". This situation was discovered by the school in mid-January and corrections were made. At this stage we are unable to determine what caused the grades to be changed during the transfer process. We have been in contact with NZQA to help source the problem and to look at any improvements that may be needed in our NCEA data management. Again we regret any stress that this caused those affected students.

e-LEARNING START-UP

Firstly, our thanks to all of the parents and students who have started the year with BYOD. We appreciate that this is a significant financial commitment from families at the start of a school year, with all of the other costs of returning to school routine. Staff are excited to be able to use a wider range of technology in the classroom with students and we look forward to the outcomes of this work.

It is timely to acknowledge the work of our network staff who have paved the way for this digital direction at Pukekohe High School. The upgrade of the wireless services to the school was completed late last term and, during the holidays, over 160 laptops were prepared for distribution around the school, for use by students who do not have BYOD.

- Mrs Taylor has been appointed head of drama while Mrs Stutzman is on leave this year.
- Mrs Neville has been appointed assistant principal replacing, Mrs Tipene who is on study leave this year.

MANAGING STUDENT COURSES

There are 128 different subjects and 236 subject classes in our senior school. These subjects have been developed over the years in response to student learning needs and their future pathways. Our subject range is extensive and is seen as an attraction for many students wanting to come here from other schools. Into these subjects and classes we have to fit 900 senior students while maintaining acceptable class sizes.

For most, this fit occurs easily – for around 20 percent it Is not so easy. The combined effect of previous year's exam results, students wishing to change their courses from that selected last year, and timetable clashes means re-designing their courses. This is done by individual interview and, regrettably, does take time. We appreciate the patience of affected students as this is completed.
