THE PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE: Nau mai haere mai. This is our first newsletter for 2019. I have been really pleased with how the great majority of our students have started this year. The atmosphere in our classrooms and around our campus is a very positive one. The year began with a moving Poowhiri/Poohiri for our Year 9 students and all those new to Pukekohe High School, including some from overseas - welcome to you all as you join our community.

One of our themes for this year is making a strong statement about the school's values. This work has been led by a group of teaching staff and I would like to pay tribute to, and thank them, for their mahi. The team worked in consultation with students and families to revision our values, which are intended to help raise expectations and standards for our whole school. We intend that our values will be a focus for daily conversations between staff and students and we hope that our wider community will become increasingly aware of them too. This term we are exploring Kotahitanga: getting to know each other, working together and developing a genuine sense of community. You will find a matrix of all our Values on our website. That theme of Kotahitanga has been very evident during Swimming and Athletics finals and I have enjoyed watching some excellent performances as well as seeing the spirit of competitiveness and enjoyment among our students.



As you will be aware, we have made some significant changes to our IT network over the summer break, including installing KAMAR as the School Management System. A key reason for this change was to enable us to more effectively track and monitor student achievement, and to share that information with our parents. If you have recently attended Academic Conferences with your daughter's or son's Vertical Form teacher, you will know that we are reintroducing the opportunity for you to meet with subject teachers later in the year. A further theme for 2019 is improving attendance and punctuality. Declining attendance is a national concern in New Zealand schools and one we are determined to address this year at Pukekohe High. Your child's attendance is live on the Parent Portal on the school's website and your support with ensuring their regular attendance will be greatly appreciated.



TAIKATO

PUKEKOHE HIGH SCHOOL WORKS TO STRENGTHEN WAIKATO-TAINUI IWI ALIGNMENT

Since Pukekohe High School is physically positioned within the Waikato rohe and is also a Waikato-Tainui kawenata school, we are guided by the tikanga and language protocols of the Waikato-Tainui iwi. This means that we use a double vowel in text to indicate a long vowel sound, such as in the words Maaori and Poowhiri/Poohiri. This is not a spelling mistake but a recognition of our partnership with, and respect for, the Waikato-Tainui people.
