THE PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE: Kia ora koutou. At the time of writing there are only two weeks of the school year remaining, and the usual Term 4 sensation of tempus fugit or "time flies"! This last newsletter of 2019 is an opportunity to look back on some of the things that have been achieved this year, and the chance to look ahead to changes planned for 2020.

We are currently in the middle of our House-based Year 10 camps at Tapapakanga Regional Park, a new venture for the school and a replacement for Te Ara Poutama. The feedback from students has been extremely positive, and the success of these camps owes much to the leadership of Ms Williams, Ms Remington and Mr Forch, as well as the active participation of students and staff. We intend that these camps will become an important experience for Year 10 students for years to come.

This year we also wish to celebrate the growing involvement of our community in the life of the school. This takes many forms – regular hui and fono for our Maaori and Pasifika families; a small but committed Parent Teacher Association; and the positive interactions at this year's parent-teacher conferences. Next year we are planning a new school website and more frequent newsletters to keep our whole community better informed. The move to a horizontal structure for our system of pastoral care, and the appointment of two Deans per year level, is also intended to make the school more responsive to the needs of our students and their families.



As we look back on 2019, we also want to celebrate improved attendance by our rangatahi. The number of students attending for 90% or more, the Ministry's definition of regular attendance, has risen by 8% this year, a significant improvement. We are determined to improve still further on that figure next year because of the close correlation between regular attendance and academic achievement. As a school we are aware that the key driver of attendance lies in ensuring that we have engaging learning experiences for our young people. I look forward at the start of next year to reporting on the successes that our senior students have achieved in their NCEA courses in 2019.

To those students and their families who are leaving Pukekohe High School at the end of this year, I wish you well for whatever the future holds for you. To all our PHS community, my best wishes for a happy Christmas and a relaxing and enjoyable summer break.

WAKA AMA SUCCESS FOR OUR GIRLS



Six girls represented Pukekohe High School at the recent Junior Auckland Secondary Schools Waka Ama regatta: Keziah Tarapa, Aimee Tautari, Arianna Moana, Oralia Renata, Marissa Gallagher and Meleane Clarke.

We were also grateful to take three amazing volunteers who worked tirelessly in the loading bay, Olivia Russek, Trinity O'Sullivan and Pono Pomare-Brown.

The girls had two races. The first, a 500m race including a turn, where they won their heat by seven seconds and headed into the championship final as the fastest qualifying team. The girls paddled hard to bring home a silver medal in their 500m championship final.

The second race was a 250m straight sprint where the team hit a headwind out in lane 4 and finished fourth place in their plate final, missing out on a medal by milliseconds. It was a glorious day for Waka Ama at our school bringing home our first set of Waka Ama medals.

TEACHERS ENGAGE IN TREATY PD





The kaupapa (theme) for the teachers' professional learning and development day was Te Tiriti o Waitangi. There was a morning workshop for all teachers, facilitated by Rachael Tuwhangai, followed by the afternoon spent in faculties, discussing and planning for the development of this kaupapa and the integration into learning programmes for 2020. Rachael works as the Managing Director of MAPSS, focusing on Teacher PLD, Evaluation and Research, Online Language Teaching and Assessment, Digital Technologies including App Development and Board Directorships. Rachael is also a New School Build Governance Facilitator, which involves supporting Boards of Trustees through the New School Build Process.

Teachers had the opportunity to develop their knowledge and understanding of Te Tiriti o Waitangi from a historical context ('The Past'), how Te Tiriti o Waitangi is included in our current practices ('The Present'), and the commitment to honour Te Tiriti o Waitangi into 'The Future' to enable equity and excellence. Teachers engaged in collaborative sense-making about the implications of Te Tiriti o Waitangi for teaching and learning and began planning to integrate this into teaching and learning programmes for 2020.

MICROSOFT SPECIALISTS



Year 11 students Ranko Sasanami and Brody Austen are the first to gain Microsoft Office Specialist qualifications at Pukekohe High School. Brody successfully gained the Level 2 Word qualification and Ranko the Level 2 Excel qualification.

In a trial programme in 2019, Brody and Ranko undertook online learning for these exams during their Computer Applications classes. Both students worked very hard to gain and master the skills needed to pass these internationally recognised certificates.

Ranko is currently doing further learning during senior exam/study time to do the Word exam – if successful she will apply for NCEA Credit Inclusion for eight (8) credits, which should see her successfully complete NCEA Level 2 before she returns to Japan for 2020 following her year at PHS as an international student.

In 2020 all Computer Applications students will be a part of this programme and all PHS students are encouraged to take advantage of the learning, qualification and employment opportunities that open up through Microsoft Office Specialist, Microsoft Office Master and Microsoft Technology Associate learning and qualifications.
