Applications for Kaiaarahitanga Aakonga / Student Leadership positions

NGAA AMOKURA (Head Students - Year 12 applicants only) – 4 positions:

From the applications for leadership positions, a "short list" of 6-8 will be identified and offered the opportunity to interview for the positions of Amokura (Head student). Following the interviews the appointment of two male and two female Amokura will be made.

The role of the Amokura:

- 1. To represent the school in the community, at particular events and functions.
- 2. To lead a Kaunihera Aakonga each, working alongside the BOT Student Representative. This work involved arranging and chairing meetings, reporting the outcomes of meetings to the school, and to take a leadership role in Kaunihera Aakonga (student council) projects.
- 3. To fulfil student leadership roles such as in assemblies, achievement celebrations, Year 13 graduation, inter-school exchanges, and other similar occasions that may arise.
- 4. To co-ordinate arrangements for the school ball.

NGAA KAIAARAHI KAUNIHERA (Council Leaders - previously Prefects and House Leaders) – 20 positions:

The main role of these leadership positions is to lead and co-ordinate ngaa Kaunihera Aakonga (student councils).

The FIVE ngaa Kaunihera Aakonga (student councils) are:

AKORANGA – Learning Council HAAKINAKINA – Sports Council

HAPORI WHAANUI – Community Council

HAUORA - Well-Being Council

TOI ME AHUREA - Arts and Culture Council

Current Year 11 and 12 aakonga (students) have the opportunity to apply for Kaiaarahi Kaunihera roles.

Additionally, there will be leadership opportunities for Year 10 aakonga – TWO per Kaunihera Aakonga.

Each te Kaunihera Aakonga will have TWO Year 10 aakonga.

KAITAUTOKO TUAKANA (Peer support leaders):

Current **Year 11 and Year 12** aakonga will also have the opportunity to apply for a Kaitautoko Tuakana role . These aakonga will be responsible for the peer mentoring and induction of new Year 9 aakonga entering our school. A programme of induction and mentoring will be established and training will be provided for Kaitautoko Tuakana to be able implement this programme with Year 9 aakonga. Kaitautoko Tuakana will also be supported (including training) by a Teacher in charge.

Monday 25 November All applicants will be advised if successful or unsuccessful in being selected

for interview for a Kaihautuu-aakonga position

Mon 2 to Fri 6 Dec Interviews this week for positions of Head Students

House Leader positions determined – no formal interview process

Friday 6 December Successful Head Students and House Leaders notified

Tuesday 10 December Head Student and House Leaders presented at Year 10 Prize-Giving.
