<p>We recommend this subject to students who combine design and photography skills with a passion for reading film, and a strong fluency in writing. Students learn various roles in the media, from freelance journalism to sub-editing. This includes working in groups to develop an idea for a school magazine and producing a feature article or a short film for a school arts event. Students become confident with how to present images and text using Adobe PhotoShop, Indesign and PremierPro and AfterEffects. In addition, the role of the media producer and the audience are analysed in detail, and skills around understanding different points in history and their influences play a key role. This course will allow you to debate and challenge stereotypes in the media and understand the powerful influence of the media.</p>
