Sustainable Youth Leadership Programme

We are pleased to report that Grace Collo has been selected for the Auckland Council's Young Leaders Sustainability Programme, Manukau Harbour wananga from 21-23 April 2021.

This leadership and mentoring programme, supported by the Manukau Harbour Forum and framed around the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, provides a unique opportunity for Grace to spend three days connecting with peers from schools across the region. She will interact with experts, learn skills, and find out first-hand about the key issues facing the Manukau Harbour and its waterways.

The Sustainable Schools team will also support Grace throughout the year to develop her leadership skills and implement sustainability actions in her local community. This will include Grace attending further one day hui during each of the July and October school holidays.

Hikoi to Rangariri

On Friday 12th March, Students from 11 MAO, 12 TAK and 13 TAK spent the day at Rangiriri Urupa and Pa where representatives from Ngaati Naho shared part of their local narrative on what happened at Rangiriri. We were supported by local Ngaati Tamaoho board member Toi Katipa and his team.

It was an amazing experience and our MAO and TAK students can use what we learned in their respective research projects going forward.



Tauranga Jazz Festival

On 1st April, the Stage Band and the PHS Quintet Jazz Combo travelled to Tauranga for the National Youth Jazz Festival. There were over 400 students from 42 schools competing aver two days, giving 45 performances in the Baycourt Theatre. Each ensemble played their set and was given an on-stage workshop with one of the judges.

Two of our musicians were presented with individual awards. The standard of musicianship was extremely high across the competition, so being selected for an individual award is a significant personal achievement.

Congratulations to Alex Vujanic for being awarded the trophy for Most Outstanding Saxophonist, and to Devin O'Callaghan for being awarded the trophy for Best Big Band Drummer.

Our two ensembles were both awarded Gold Certificates and the Stage Band was presented with the New Orleans Trophy for Most Outstanding Big Band. Huge Congratulations to all of our musicians!
