




# PUKEKOHE HIGH SCHOOL NEWSLETTER

### **School Bus Changes 2022**



This year will see some changes to our school transport as the Ministry of Education transitions to a new contract with bus operators. The school bus operator is changing on some of our routes. We are working closely with our school bus operators and the Ministry of Education to ensure that the transition to the new school bus operator goes well.

As always, please either stay with your children while they are waiting for their school transport in the morning or keep in contact with them to make sure that they are picked up safely.

### Returning to School at Alert Level Red

All students must wear face coverings. Please ensure that you bring a mask with you each day. Replacement masks are available at the office should you lose or break your mask during the day.

We are encouraging social distancing at break times and vigilance during the current outbreak. We will communicate any changes to you directly as they are announced from the Ministry of Education. Please remember to do the following:

- Regularly wash and thoroughly dry your hands and use hand sanitiser.
- Sneeze and cough into your elbow.
- Social distance where possible
- If you have cold, flu or COVID-19 symptoms, stay home and get a test.

### Covid-19 Vaccinations for Co and Extra-curricular Activities

As we are open for on-site learning during alert level red, we need to ensure we are adhering to the Covid-19 Protection Framework (CPF) as advised from the Ministry of Education.

Students do not need to be vaccinated to attend school, however vaccination may be required to participate in certain cocurricular and extra-curricular activities. We will advise which activities require full vaccination status at the time of signing up. We will endeavour to suggest alternative activities in the place of those requiring vaccination.

The preferred proof of vaccination is:

- Vaccine Pass
- A Vaccination Certificate (issued from the Ministry of Health)
- My Covid Record (image must include the students full name)
- A letter from their GP (with both vaccination dates)

We cannot accept the purple vaccination card given at the time of vaccination. Please contact the organiser of the activity to arrange sending the vaccination proof through.

#### **BYOD Information**

As a school we don't believe that mandating a particular device is necessary, and because individual student needs differ, this can be a complex question to answer. We do, however, suggest you consider carefully the following minimum specifications for a suitable digital device at Pukekohe High School:

- Standard Intel/AMD processors with 1 Ghz and above, Apple– Standard
- 128 GB (Windows/Apple) Hard Disk
- 4 GB RAM
- · Wireless networking capability
- ullet 5 hours of use from one battery charge
- Windows 10 home (Not in S mode), Apple Mac OS
- Large screen (7.9 inches minimum) enough to work with documents in order to create and edit content
- The ability to run a web browser (e.g. Chrome, Firefox, Internet Explorer) that will allow it to access Internet and other learning resources

- Video Camera Capability To perform online classes during lockdowns
- Is lightweight, but robust enough to handle daily use
- Is in a protective carrying case
- The school will provide an account for Office 365 for all students. This can be installed on up to five devices and will give access to all MS Office 365 in a web browser or on their device
- Given the above guidelines we suggest you consider using a full function Windows laptop
- For Chromebooks Intel Celeron Dual Core / Quad-Core above, 1 GHz above, 4Gb RAM, 64 Gb Hard Disk, Wi-Fi, Camera

#### **Important Notes:**

- Chromebooks are compatible with our network. If you already have one from your previous school, please bring it.
