Chemistry Students Hard at Work

As featured on our newsletter banner this issue, our year 12 chemistry students in Mrs Haley's class are finding out the solubility of an ionic solid in a polar and non polar solvent.

The students then discuss the solubility of the solids based on the solute-solute forces, solvent-solvent forces and solute-solvent forces. This explains why some solids are readily soluble in certain liquids and why some are not.



Curriculum Update - Ministry of Education

The Ministry of Education have embarked on an important journey to review and refresh 'The New Zealand Curriculum'. The 'The New Zealand Curriculum' underpins teaching and learning for students in Aotearoa New Zealand English-medium schools from Year 1 – Year 13.

'The New Zealand Curriculum' is being refreshed to make sure every child experiences success in their learning, and that their progress and achievement is responded to and celebrated.

The refresh will be phased from now until the end of 2025, to help make it more manageable for schools to implement the refreshed curriculum.



Simultaneously, the Ministry of Education and teachers in schools across Aotearoa New Zealand are also working on the NCEA Review of Achievement Standards. This review will see significant changes to the way our students in Years 11 – 13 are learning and being assessed. The new standards are scheduled to be implemented in 2024 (Level 1), 2025 (Level 2) and 2026 (Level 3).

An important part of the new NCEA framework will be the new co-requisite Achievement Standards for Literacy and Numeracy. Currently, these are intended to be introduced in 2023.

At Pukekohe High School we have begun to strengthen our teaching for literacy and numeracy. We have initiated professional learning and development of strategies to support literacy and numeracy learning to ensure our students build the necessary skills across the junior school and into learning for NCEA.



Home-School partnership, effective relationships and effective practices are key factors that enable positive teaching and learning in literacy and numeracy. You can support your students' literacy and numeracy learning at home by:

- 1. Engaging with your student about what they are learning in class;
- 2. Promoting a positive attitude to literacy and numeracy;
- 3. Encouraging regular reading; and
- 4. Supporting your student with homework where possible.
