As always, please either stay with your children while they are waiting for their school transport in the morning or keep in contact with them to make sure that they are picked up safely.

Attendance Procedures

The attendance procedures for our school, including lateness, sickness and requests to leave early are set out below.

- Students are required to be at school prior to 8.40am each day to get to their whānau rōpu (form room) on time at 8.45am
- If your student is late they must go to the Student Support Building and sign in, where they will be given a late pass
- Students are expected to be at school all day but if required to go to an appointment they must have written approval and once again, sign in and out at the Student Support Building
- If your student is away for any reason please phone our attendance officer on 09 237 0198 to advise of the absence and also a note for the whānau rōpu teacher on return
- An alternative to a phone call is an email to <u>attendance@pukekohehigh.school.nz</u> or a message through the Kamar parent portal or the school app. Neither of these require a follow up note.
- Any prolonged illness will require a medical certificate
- If you choose to take your student out of school for a sporting event, holiday, family function etc a leave request for this is to be completed. This form can be collected from the student centre and must be accompanied with a note from yourself stating the reason for the leave

BYOD Information

As a school we don't believe that mandating a particular device is necessary, and because individual student needs differ, this can be a complex question to answer. We do, however, suggest you consider carefully the following minimum specifications for a suitable digital device at Pukekohe High School:

- above, Apple-Standard
- 128GB (Windows/Apple) Hard Disk
- 4GB Ram
- Wireless networking capability
- 5 hours of use from one battery charge
- Windows 10 home (Not in S mode), Apple Mac OS
- Large screen (7.9 inches minimum) enough to work with documents in order to create and edit content
- The ability to run a web browser (e.g. Chrome, Firefox, Internet Explorer) that will allow it to access Internet and other learning resources

- Standard Intel/AMD processors with 1 GHz and Video Camera Capability—To perform online classes during lockdowns
 - Is lightweight, but robust enough to handle daily use
 - Is in a protective carrying case
 - The school will provide an account for Office 365 for all students. This can be installed on up to five devices and will give access to all MS Office 365 in a web browser or on their device
 - Given the above guidelines we suggest you consider using a full function Windows laptop
 - For Chromebooks-Intel Celeron Dual Core / Quad-Core above, 1 GHz above, 4GB RAM, 64GB Hard Disk, Wi-Fi, Camera

Important Notes:

- Chromebooks are compatible with our network. If you already have one from your previous school, please bring it.
