Attendance:

Improving school attendance levels has been recognised as a national priority by the Ministry of Education. 'Attendance is the first step in accessing learning and is essential for educational success, achieving qualifications and attaining wider social and economic outcomes' (Ministry of Education, 2022). In order to promote and support improved school attendance, Pukekohe High School is implementing the following processes from the beginning of 2024:

- Late-to-school sign ins students who arrive to school after 8:45 will be required to sign in with a member of staff at the Harris Road gate. Families will be contacted to inform them of the lateness.
- Unexplained absence from school where a student has been absent from school for three days the school's truancy officer will contact home.
- Attendance reporting as part of fortnightly engagement reporting an attendance overview will also be provided. This will show period-by-period attendance for the fortnight.



Attendance Procedures

The attendance procedures for our school, including lateness, sickness and requests to leave early are set out below.

- Students are required to be at school prior to 8.40am each day to get to their period one class on time at 8.45am
- Students are expected to be at school all day but if required to go to an appointment they must have written approval and once again, sign in and out at the Student Support Buildina
- If your student is away for any reason please phone our attendance officer on 09 237 0198 to advise of the absence and also a note for the whaanau roopuu teacher on return
- An alternative to a phone call is an email to attendance@pukekohehigh.school.nz or a message through the Kamar parent portal or the school app. Neither of these require a follow up note.
- Any prolonged illness will require a medical certificate
- If you choose to take your student out of school for a sporting event, holiday, family function etc a leave request for this is to be completed. This form can be collected from the student centre and must be accompanied with a note from yourself stating the reason
- If you have any queries regarding attendance, please contact the attendance officer on 09 237 0198


BYOD Information

All students will be using a device as part of their learning across all areas. We ask for parental support to ensure that devices are included in school bags in readiness for learning.

As a school we don't believe that mandating a particular device is necessary, and because individual student needs differ, this can be a complex question to answer. We do, however, suggest you consider carefully the following minimum specifications for a suitable digital device at Pukekohe High School:

- Wireless networking capability using 802.11g or n
- 5 hours of use from one battery charge
- Large screen (7.9 inches minimum) enough to work with documents in order to create and edit content
- The ability to run a web browser (e.g. Chrome, Firefox, Internet Explorer) that will allow it to access Internet and other learning resources
- The school will provide an account for Office 365 for all students. This can be installed on up to five devices and will give access to all MS Office 365 in a web browser or on their device.
- Touch screen and stylus capability (desirable but not necessary)
- Is lightweight, but robust enough to handle daily use
- Is in a protective carrying case

Given the above guidelines we suggest you seriously consider using a full function Windows laptop. Local and online suppliers are aware of our recommendations and will help you choose the right device for your student, its use at school and your budget. Important Note: Although not ideal, Chromebooks are compatible with our network.





We do have some Ministry of Education devices that we are able to loan out to students, however, we are prioritising our senior year 12 and 13 students for the distribution of these devices.
