# CHOOSING SUBJECTS FOR 2026 (Years 11–13)

Course Selection Overview (2025–2026)

### STEP 1: LOGIN TO SCHOOLPOINT

- Go to: https://pukekohe.bridge.school.nz/course\_selection
- Parents/caregivers can view selections (read-only). Students must make their selections via their login.
- Ask your student to login using their school Microsoft ID and password.
- Set Leaving intention to returning.
- Tip: Download the SchoolPoint app for mobile access.

### **STEP 2: STUDENT SUBJECT REQUIREMENTS**

#### Year 11 (2026)

#### **Compulsory Subjects:**

- English Contemporary Literature / English World Literature / ESOL / Te Reo Maaori
- Mathematics (General or with Statistics)
- Science (General or In Context)
  - Compulsory courses must be selected before optional courses can be selected.

#### **Option Subjects**

• 3 different options across all learning areas + a backup

#### Year 12 (2026):

- Choose 6 subjects from any Learning Area + a backup
- If planning to go to university, include English in your selections

### Year 13 (2026):

- Choose 5 subjects + a backup
- If returning in 2026, set your SchoolBridge Leaving Intentions to "Returning" before you can select.

**Note:** Some courses require prior achievement or have subject restrictions. Apply for an exemption if needed. MIT Trade courses require an Expression of Interest form to be completed with the Careers Department.

#### STEP 3: SELECTING SUBJECTS

## To select a subject:

- 1. Go to "Courses I've Selected"
- 2. Choose from "Learning Areas" or "Courses for Me"
- 3. Click ✓ Select Course, then Confirm Selection
- 4. Repeat until all required subjects and a backup are selected

MIT Trades students: Add 2FPTRADE or 3FPTRADE, & complete an Expression of Interest form for Mrs. Matthews

#### STEP 5: FINALISE SELECTIONS

- Make sure your required number of subjects is selected
- Click "I'm Complete" when all your courses have been selected
- · Generate a summary report to review Learning Areas and assessments
